While that blog is no longer so active (too much work), its concepts underlay this one. At the time I'd thought it might PERHAPS be possible to segregate financial (operations) information, which lacks the curb appeal of dramatic reporting on abuse, violence, and injustice problems in the family courts, to better help people deal with it. It's technical – but also broad overview in nature.

Nowadays (July, 2019 as of this updated intro), I don't even pretend the issues are separable, or believe they are instead I just keep the importance of finding and reading the financials in people's faces much more. Needless to say, this isn't the most popular way to handle the issues with people looking for moral support, social bonding, and at all stages of processing through trauma, disbelief, anger, and desire to

either join or start the closest cause and show the fastest results possible.

It's certainly not popular with most of the involved professionals either.
