File this under -The Case of the Extra "AND"- the EIN# below connects to tax returns which clearly OMIT the "AND" on organization name, both at the "990finder" site and even uploaded to this website (to access, repeat the live search to this "Search Results" page then clicking on "Organization Name" as instructions say). DETAILS, show a Jan 2011 letter demanding RRFs (org. was in noncompliance), and more OAG-generated discrepancies/labeling Form 990 vs. Form 990EZ in the (OAG/RCT-level) "Related Documents" section below the Annual Renewal Schedule. What looks like some Form 990, and others Form 990EZ seem mostly "EZ."

It seems that most of them are actually Form 990EZ, meaning that the organization is thus obscuring its date of formation, and other information a full header would provide. For what it's worth, details also show that in FY2015, the entity went from Calendar Yr to July 1 - Jun30 Fiscal Yr (so '2015' Jan-Jun was a short year's filing, although its revenues and assets were equal to or greater than other years'...)

For more detailed information on an organization's registration, click on the Organization Name from the alphabetical list below. If there are additional pages of the search results, there will be clickable page numbers at the bottom of the list. The maximum number of pages is 25 so if you do not find the organization for which you are searching, click the 'Search Again' button and change the search criteria.

FYI - Displaying FEIN# in basic search results is a recent (Dec 2013) addition to this user interface at Calif's OAG Registry Search site. Also added — field Applicant #. What would've been more helpful was the SOS identifier field "California Entity#", which IS included in the database (and displays in next level (except for orgs. whose "Status" is labeled "Exempt"). That is, the database HAS the ENTITY# information anyhow, and as often as orgs tend to change their names at one site or the other (or, case in point here, where the Org. Name itself as entered HERE doesn't even match its IRS filing name) it would've been helpful to include here. I have no idea why displaying "APPLICANT #" was thought to be more useful to the public(?) than the Entity#.
