The Ohio Intimate Partner Violence (IPV) Collaborative (Collaborative) mission is to increase the safety and well-being of children exposed to domestic violence. True to its name, the Collaborative partners with local, state, and national practitioners and policymakers to advocate for best practices. A number of projects facilitate this important work. One such project is the rollout of Safe and Together™ training throughout the state in a partnership with David Mandel & Associates, the Ohio Department of Job & Family Services, the Supreme Court of Ohio, the HealthPath Foundation of Ohio, and 10 fully certified, Ohio-based trainers. Child welfare agencies and their community partners learn how to partner with non-offending parents and hold batterers accountable so that children may remain safely with the non-offending parent when possible, thus reducing their trauma. By mid-2016, the Collaborative trained over half of Ohio's 88 counties. Additionally, dozens of members across the state have completed a model community response protocol to adapt training concepts to Ohio's communities (now available on this website!). Results of an evaluation of model implementation have also been posted.
